ACTIVITIES OFFERED AT LARC

LARC participants enjoy daily activities, games, art, crafts, gardening projects, pet visits, inter-generational activities, chair exercises and yoga, daily live musical entertainment, and much joy and laughter. In addition, we offer a variety of community service projects. Recently our participants made no-sew fleece blankets which were sent to wounded American soldier's in Afghanistan by the Soldiers' Angels group. These projects build self-esteem and show that our folks are still a vital and contributing part of society.





LARC celebrates several theme weeks per year (Luau, Circus, Holidays, etc.). Special inter-generational activities with our neighboring preschoolers (Oakland ZooMobile, circus clowns, sing-a-longs, crafts) add a wonderful dimension to the days of our participants as they relish the laughter and energy of the children.

Therapy pet visits engage and comfort our participants as they experience the unconditional love of a furry friend. Our pet visitors spark conversation and sharing of special memories.

- 11:00 a.m. Arrival, Coffee, Introductions Social interaction. Discussion and reflections honor the participants for who they are and what they know. Conversation is carefully balanced by a facilitator.
- 11:15 a.m. Morning Activities Word Games, Reading, Crafts, Art, Gardening. Sensory and Cognitive Stimulation are provided through carefully constructed group activities.
- 12:15 p.m. Exercise Chair Yoga, Aerobics, Weight Toning, Dance and Stretching
- 12:30 p.m. Lunch participants bring their own lunches.

- 1:00 p.m. Entertainment Musicians come daily onsite to share their talents at our Sing-a-long.
